




While 2018 is largely yet unknown and filled with possibility, let us take into account our accomplishments in Tyler Park last year:

Accomplishments:

- Wine Tasting Committee: Wine Tasting Chile and Argentina - sold out and raised \$3400 for the Tyler Park Fund
- Membership Committee: Added Eyedia as a business member. Maintained in individual/family memberships (people moving out and moving in balanced each other out); have 359 paid members including 24 business members
- Events Committee: Marched in St. Patrick's Day Parade in March; Held annual Easter Egg Hunt in April
- Tree Committee: Added a Trees page to the website; planted five more trees than last year for a total of 28
- Jazz Fest Committee: Held 8th Annual "Sundays in September" Jazz Festival with 3 concerts
- Quality of Life Committee: Developed some basic goals for a future neighborhood or strategic plan effort
- Master Plan Committee: \$1,115,000 was allocated from Louisville Metro and the Olmsted Conservancy for implementing Tyler Park Master Plan Phase 1
- Presented a check to Highlands/Shelby Park Branch of the Louisville Free Public Library
- President is representative of TPNA on new District 8 Advisory Board and is on the Development Committee; attended first meetings for each
- Delivery of new home owners' welcome baskets

Tyler Park Annual Meeting, held October 26

The Annual Meeting of the Tyler Park Neighborhood Association was held on October 26, 2017, at the Highlands-Shelby Park Library. The guest speaker was Jeff O'Brien, Deputy Director for the Louisville Metro Office of Advanced Planning. Mr. O'Brien discussed the new update for the Comprehensive Plan for Louisville Metro. The Comprehensive Plan guides land use, growth and development in our community.

Mr. O'Brien stated that the community engagement process has focused on six Work Group

components: Community Facilities; Community Form; Housing; Livability & Environment; Marketplace/Economic Development; and Mobility. This process has included over fifty Work Group meetings, dozens of meetings with community organizations and advocates, nine community forums and two community surveys. From this, goals, objectives and policies have been developed to guide future land use and growth for Louisville Metro.

At present, the draft recommendations are being reviewed by an Advisory Committee; the Advisory Committee will continue its review through early 2018. Once that is complete, a draft document will be prepared and presented for public review in the Winter of 2018. It will then be forwarded to a public hearing before the Planning Commission, with final approval by Metro Council and 12 suburban cities. Adoption of the updated Comprehensive Plan is anticipated by the end of 2018.

Want to Volunteer for Repair Affair?

The TPNA board is considering helping others in the Louisville Metro area by participating in the "Repair Affair". This involves a volunteer crew from our neighborhood helping to repair homes that deserving owners cannot maintain on their own. The main organizing effort is by the New Directions Housing Corporation (NDHC). They locate the clients whose homes are in need of small to medium repairs and then coordinate crews of volunteers from various local businesses and organizations to do those jobs. NDHC provides all supplies needed and removes all residue from the job. Their website is: www.ndhc.org search for Repair Affair. What Tyler Park supplies is volunteers for one Saturday morning. The exact schedule is not yet established for 2018 but the event is usually early in June. Most of the work will be completed by mid afternoon or earlier. We need to have some idea of who can commit to participate by mid April so that the level of repair that the TPNA volunteers will undertake can be established. This is done by a Crew Captain from TPNA who works with NDHC to select the home to work on. Volunteers can be anyone from totally unskilled to accomplished handy person. Crew size can be as few as 4 to as many as 12. The work can consist of anything from repainting to building a wheel chair ramp. Often there are several items at one home that get attention from the larger crews. If serious power tools are involved, the volunteer that operates them will need to bring them.

This is an initial call for TPNA volunteers, to see if we can "field a team" to take on a project home. I have had experience with a similar program from my earlier home in Maryland and went to 2017's Repair Affair here in Louisville. So I will volunteer to be the interim Team Captain for TPNA. re-Foresting

Reforest is defined as "to replant trees on (land denuded by cutting or fire)"¹ and that applies to our neighborhood. We built things, we fretted about falling limbs, and insects ate the ash trees. So chainsaws came out and we lost environment, property values, and habitat. Then we looked at the stretches that had been "denuded by cutting" and we wondered where our tree lined streets had gone.

We have lost the trees from the past but we are planting the trees for our future. This year, our second annual MSD reforestation grant brought ten large trees, sixteen medium trees, and two small trees, totaling twenty-eight trees of fifteen species.

Lena and Bill also transplanted one of the trees from last year. New homeowners doing major remodeling had decided to change the landscaping and were kind enough to save the little yellowwood for us. They also planted a replacement for a dead tree, ending with a net gain of two trees on their property. Well done.

Katherine Moberly and I had the honor of being the co-chairs for the project this year.



A Tyler Park Tribute To Martha Elson

For over forty years, longtime Courier-Journal reporter Martha Elson reported diligently on issues related to Louisville neighborhoods and historic preservation. Her passing in spring 2017 silenced one of Louisville's great advocates for neighborhoods and the people in them. Tyler Park Neighborhood was certainly a recipient of her great journalism.

For 25 years in my role as a Tyler Park resident, former TPNA President, Board Member, and Garden Tour Co-Chair (along with neighbor Terry Redden) it has been my pleasure to have worked with Martha as she covered items of great importance not only to Tyler Park, but to the community as a whole. Martha Elson covered the Tyler Park Garden Tour for the past eleven years, personally taking pictures of the gardens on tour and writing descriptions of the gardens that placed the reading public in the gardens without having been on the tour!

Martha also covered many of the hard fought victories that Tyler Park Neighborhood has undertaken that today stand as a legacy to her journalism, and advocacy for historic properties and neighborhoods. Martha's coverage was pivotal in the lengthy and contentious fight to save historic Bloom Elementary School on Lucia Avenue, now an award winning example of historic renovation and a top performing school in Jefferson County. More recently, Martha covered the successful resolution to prevent inappropriate infilling next to the historic Rosewood Condominiums on Rosewood Avenue. These are only two of the many issues that Martha Elson has covered over the years in our neighborhood. Martha was quick, accurate, and sensitive to the challenges and successes we have had over the years in Tyler Park Neighborhood and she never refused to cover a newsworthy issue.

Tyler Park Neighborhood will always remember a journalist who not only loved her work, she loved her community and the issues that make us who we all are. —

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Eyedia with New Owners Relocates to Baxter Ave.

Let me introduce you to Eyedia, one of our newest businesses along the Baxter Avenue corridor. It's a beautifully arranged consignment store featuring furniture, rugs and other home decor, with the feel of an exclusive home furnishing boutique.

The owners, Connie Roitman and Misha Meinhold, purchased the store from Martha Neal Cooke and Diane Stege in January 2016. Connie and Misha moved it from its former Mellwood location to its present spot at 926 Baxter Avenue (It's directly across from Molly Malone's). They re-opened in May of 2016 at this new location. The store has 10,000 square feet, somewhat larger than the Mellwood locale. At this new spot, Connie and Misha report more walk-in customers and in fact, on their first day, they had a line out the door.

The store is very clean and easy to navigate, and you can easily spot new gems to add to your collection. Besides Connie and Misha, there are 8 employees who are well acquainted with the inventory to offer help with making a selection. If a customer is looking for something he/she doesn't see, one of the neatest aspects of the store is the 'Wish List'; just sign-up and if your 'wish' comes into the store, you will be notified. It's a truly personalized service offered at this thriving local business.

In addition to furniture, Eyedia has a large rug room. They carry high-quality rugs that typically sell for half their retail price. They also carry handmade soaps, candles, and bourbon barrel items. Finally, you will see paintings and other items created by local artists & craftsmen, and the decorated horseshoes are big sellers at Derby time.

If interested in consigning, a customer can take the item(s) to the store Tuesday - Saturday, 11-4, no appointment needed. If you have a large item to consign, take a picture and send it to <u>manager@eyediashop.com</u>, or bring the picture into the store. Eyedia, after considerable research, sets the item(s) price. There is a 90 day consignment contract that begins with an original price and will then have two 10% markdowns after each 30 days that it is in the store. At the end of the 90 days, if the item hasn't sold, it is placed in a 50% off sale; and then is donated to charity if it has not sold. The split with the consignee is 50/50. Checks are mailed to consignor on the 10th of the month following the item's sale.

The store has a large parking space in the rear of the store, via the alley. Consignment items should be taken to the rear door. Eyedia will not repair items to be consigned, but can recommend professionals who can do the repairs.

Connie and Misha have a great relationship. They say that Connie makes everything look pretty and Misha makes everything run smoothly. I say that's a great combination! 
