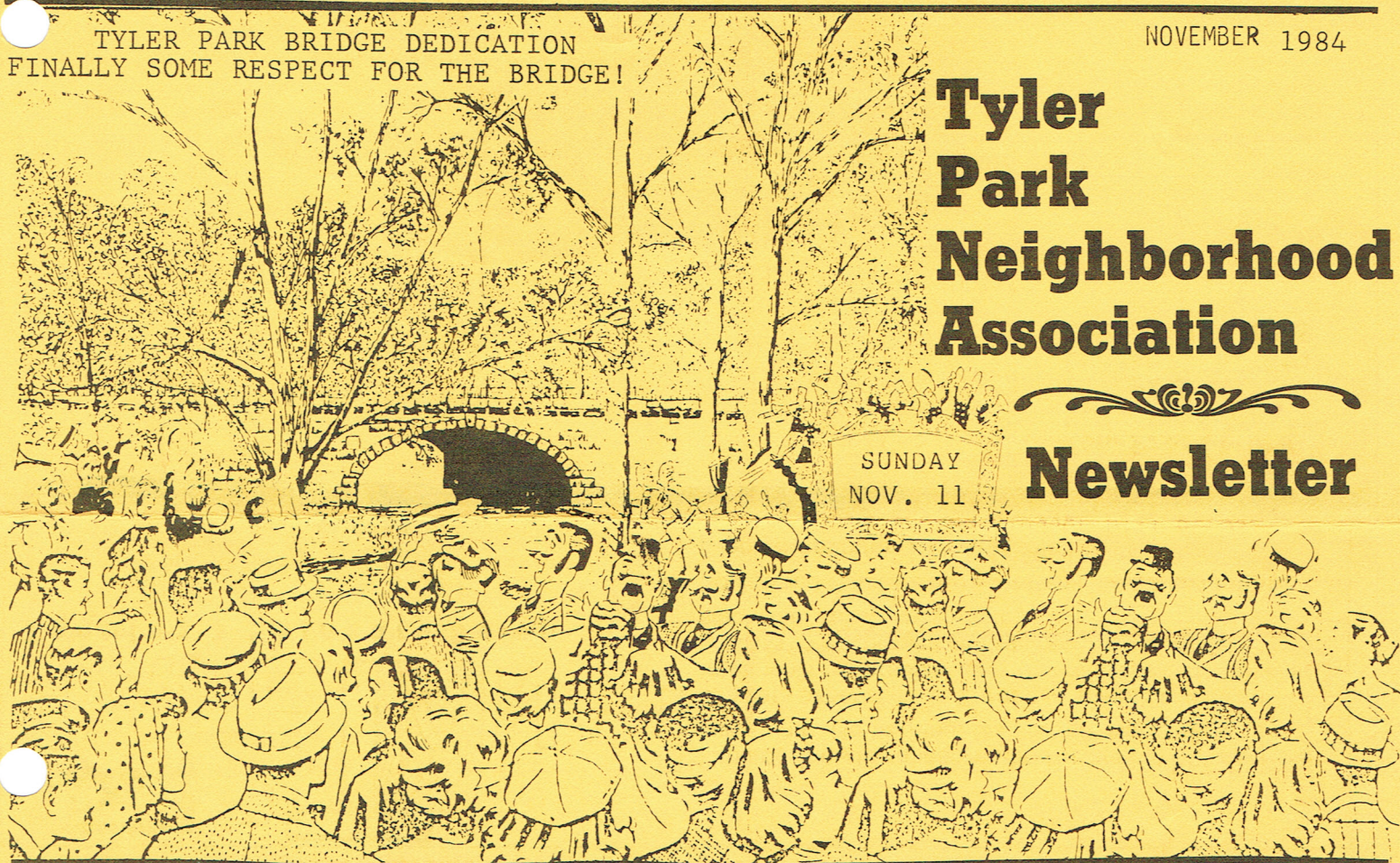

TYLER PARK BRIDGE DEDICATION

Mayor Harvey Sloane and Aldermen Mike Carrell and Steve Magre will be on hand for the ceremony to dedicate the Tyler Park Bridge on Sunday, November 11, at 4:30 p.m. The dedication culminates a long effort by Board member, Herb Zimmerman, to insure the historical character of the bridge. Declared a local landmark by the Louisville Landmarks Commission last summer, the bridge is now protected from any changes which are not in keeping with its original structure and appearance. The stone bridge, which divides Tyler Park into two sections, is the most distinctive feature of the Park and of the neighborhood. It supports a segment of Baxter Avenue, a state artery, and its landmark status means that any repairs on the bridge have to be in keeping with its historical character.

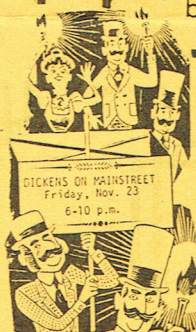
