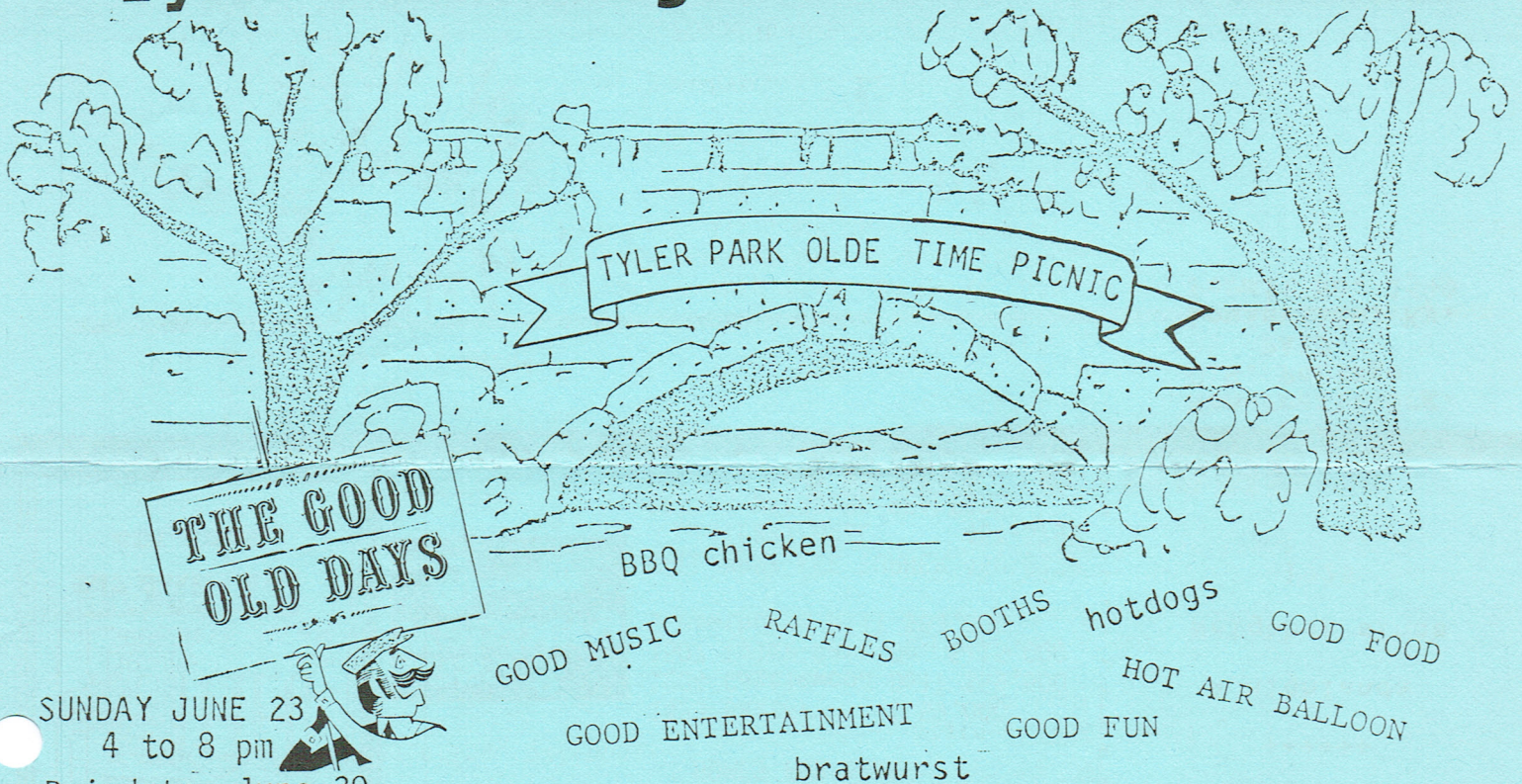

# WITH YOUR HELP POLICE CAN DO THEIR JOB BETTER

The Tyler Park area is one of the safest in the city, but you can help make it safer according to Lt. Rodney Cline and Officer Phil Ray from the First District of the Louisville Police who answered questions at the board meeting on May 20.

Thefts from vehicles are this area's primary problem. If you see a theft or a potential crime taking place get as full a description of persons as possible, and write it down immediately. Notice age, race, sex, height and weight. Compare your weight and height with theirs. Pick out some unique characteristics. Also write down what happened, when, where, vehicle description and license number. Then call the police.

Cline and Ray explained that this procedure is more effective in stopping crime in the long run than calling the police immediately. Why? Because an experienced thief can be in and out of a locked vehicle in at little as three minutes making it impossible for police to arrive on the scene in time. Your information will be valuable in convicting a thief when caught.

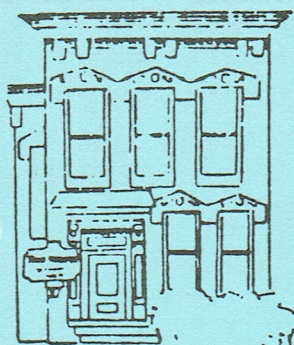

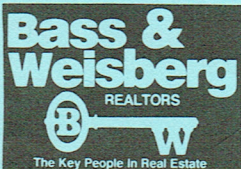
