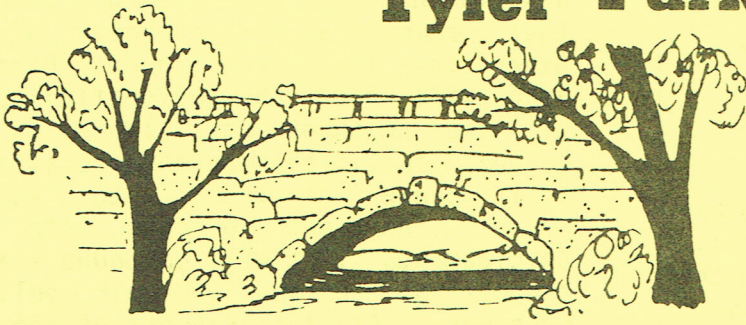

## ZONING ? Changes

Public hearings will be held soon on zoning and land use along Bardstown Road from Highland Avenue to the Watterson Expressway. In the Tyler Park Neighborhood, commercial zoning extends back from the west side of Bardstown Road for 120-150 feet, taking the first

several lots on each side street. The TPNA Board along with other neighborhood associations in the area are concerned that commercial development of lots other than those fronting onto Bardstown Road will harm the residential quality of the neighborhood. There is also concern that such deep commercial zoning will cause developers to assemble several adjacent parcels into large developments that will compound traffic, congestion, noise and air pollution problems. At the request of the Board of Aldermen, the Planning and Zoning Commission made a study of the Bardstown corridor and will announce public hearings to discuss this study. TPNA will participate in these hearings based on positions adopted by its Board.

Residents can do three things.

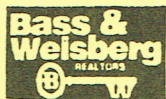
- 1) become informed about possible changes, which will be covered in detail by the daily newspapers.
- 2) let the TPNA Board know your opinions at a Board meeting or by contacting one of its officers or members. TPNA president is Tom Lyons, 456-1418.
- 3) if you desire, participate directly by attending or speaking at public hearings and by communicating with members of the Board of Aldermen, Mike Garrell or Steve Magre in particular.
