Public hearings will be held soon on zoning and land use along Bardstown Road from Highland Avenue to the Watterson Expressway. In the Tyler Park Neighborhood, commercial zoning extends back from the west side of Bardstown Road for 120-150 feet, taking the first

several lots on each side street. The TPNA Board along with other neighborhood associations in the area are concerned development of lots commercial other than those fronting onto Bardstown Road will harm the residential quality the neighborhood. There is also concern that such deep commercial zoning cause developers to assemble several adjacent parcels into large developments that will compound traffic, congestion, , noise and air pollution At the request of the Board problems. of Aldermen, the Planning and Zoning Commission made a study of the Bardstown corridor and will announce public hearings to discuss this study. TPNA will participate in these hearings based on positions adopted by its Board.
