

ADDRESS NUMBERS MUST BE AT LEAST 3" TALL BEFORE JANUARY 1, 1987

To assist police, fire, and EMS crews in locating homes and businesses, the Board of Aldermen recently passed an ordinance requiring all Louisville homes and businesses to have their address numbers properly displayed. Numbers must be at least three inches high and be placed so they are visible from the street. Garages do not have to be separately numbered.

If you don't comply and are cited for a violation, fines can be up to \$50 per day until the numbers are put up. Put your Newsletter down and go measure your house numbers right now.

FALL PARK CLEANUP

After a partial rain-out on October 3rd and 4th, a small but energetic group turned out for the Park Cleanup on the 10th and 11th. Focusing on quality rather than quantity, they cleared out underbrush, picked up more than a dozen bags of trash, and raked leaves out of the tunnel. We really need more warm bodies out there for the next (Spring) cleanup, folks.

IS IT CRUELLA DE VILLE? DOGNAPPERS AT WORK AGAIN

Sad to say, dogs are being stolen from their yards again in the neighborhood -- smaller dogs, especially cairn terriers. Police surmise that they are quickly taken from the area and used for breeding purposes. So keep an eye on your dogs.

BURGLARIES, ASSAULTS UP -POLICE RECOMMEND BLOCK WATCHES

Most of the incidents have been made easier for the perpetrators by open doors and windows. SO WHAT HAPPENED TO THE PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT?



TYLER PARK JUNK PICKUP EVERY THIRD MONDAY

The City of Louisville's new monthly junk pick-up program - Operation Brightside's Project Pick-up - has now started. Residents of the City of Louisville (and only City of Louisville residents) can now put out as many as three bulk items per month to be collected by City Sanitation crews.

Here are the rules of Project Pick-Up:

- 1) Put out a total of 3 bulk items or bundles each month. (Only 3 will be picked up each month.)
- 2) Place the junk at your regular garbage collection point, but don't mix garbage and junk together.
- 3) Place small or loose items in containers or bundles (maximum of three containers or bundles). Loose items not in containers or bundles will *not* be picked up.
- 4) Remove doors on discarded refrigerators for safety reasons.
- 5) Place junk items at your regular garbage collection point by 6:00 A.M. on the Monday of your collection week.
