

PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT IN PLACE; DEDICATION MARCH 30

As everyone must surely have noticed now that the weather is better, the new playground equipment has at last been installed both in the Tot Lot and on the lower level of Tyler Park, and is already getting heavy use from neighborhood kids. You are invited to a formal dedication of the equipment, which will take place on March 30 at 10 AM, with Alderman Mike Carrell leading a troop of folks from Bloom School (which is celebrating its 90th birthday) to the lower park.

In addition to thanking Mike Carrell, who was instrumental in obtaining funding, we would like to thank some folks in the Metro Parks Department for shepherding the playground project along: Anita Solodkin (Metro Parks Planner), Mike Dahl (Park Engineer), and Bob Douglass (Park Maintenance Supervisor). They worked with our own tireless Joan Dubay (the chair of the new Park Enrichment committee) from concept to completion, and we appreciate their help.

A gentle but firm reminder: the equipment in the Tot Lot (upper side of park, near tennis courts) is for children under the age of 6 only. Do not hesitate to discourage older, larger kids from using this equipment, as it will simply not stand up under use and abuse by them. Watch for warning signs to be posted soon.

Tennis fans will be pleased to hear that the tennis courts will also be resurfaced this Spring. Cold weather set in this Fall before that could be completed, but stay tuned.



Since 1980, Fran Jasper has gone to a lot of effort to convert old Fire Station No. 7 at 1330 Bardstown Road into an attractive oriental rug gallery. During 1986, Fran invested even more in beautifying the exterior of the station (which is on the National Historic Registry) by adding new sidewalks and landscaping.

Earlier this month, Fran's business was one of 14 recognized by Bardstown Road Tomorrow (a non-profit group bent on improving the Bardstown Road business corridor) for their beautification efforts during 1986. BRT awarded Fran a certificate of appreciation, and Third District Alderman Mike Carrell awarded her a key to the city. Congratulations to Fran on the well deserved award.

SUMMERSCENE PROGRAMS TO RETURN




NEW ASSOCIATION SPONSORS OLMSTED IN LOUISVILLE CONFERENCE

The symposium will feature nationally known speakers on Olmsted's park landscape work, focusing on preservation efforts locally and across the country. It will run from 9 AM to 4 PM, and will be followed by a reception. The cost is \$5 for the program and \$5 for lunch. The registration fee is waived if you join the Association by paying the \$20 annual membership fee (but there's no such thing as a free lunch). Interested? HELP US KEEP SPRAY POOL OPEN

The wading pool in Tyler Park was converted into a spray pool last year, at great effort and expense. Now the Metro Parks Department and local Department of Public Health are warning that, if kids continue to block off drains in spray pools to make them back into wading pools, they may be forced to shut them down for the summer. problem is that standing water quickly develops and sustains an unhealthy level of bacteria, and the Division of Environmental Health doesn't have many choices other than shutting down the pool to protect public health.

You know how hot it can get here in the summer. Please do your part to keep kids from plugging up the spray pool. We don't need a bunch of hot, dry kids moping around the park this summer.

EASTER EGG HUNT IN PARK







FREE ADS FOR TEENS WILLING TO DO YARD WORK IN TYLER PARK AREA



Don't forget that, by January 1 of this year, you were supposed to have 3" house numbers on your house (5" for businesses) to help emergency crews find you when you need them. Fines are stiff if you are cited for violating the ordinance (\$50 per day), so hurry and get larger numbers if you need them.
