

The annual picnic in Tyler Park is always the neighborhood's major event of the year. This year's picnic will be a special homecoming event, coordinated with Jefferson Discovery '87 (a year-long homecoming celebration in Jefferson Coun-Picnic planners encourage you invite past residents of the neighborhood -- particularly families who used to live in your home.

For the first time, the picnic will be held in conjunction with an arts and crafts fair sponsored by Friends Preschool, which will run from 1 PM to 7 PM. The fair will have at least 20 tables of arts and crafts, and 10% of the table rental fees will go to TPNA (see related article below) .

What to look for this year:

Extended hours. Instead of starting at 4:00 PM, the picnic will start at 2:00 PM, allowing more neighbors to fit the picnic into their busy Sundays. As usual, the picnic will end at 8:00 PM.

Catered food. The TPNA board decided to experiment this year with letting Kentuckiana Caterers cater the food for the picnic. This will allow a lot more people to enjoy the picnic instead of sweating over hot coals or waiting for a replacement server in the food line. TPNA will get 18% of the caterer's revenue from food sales.

Bigger and Better Raffle. Although last year's raffle offered many valuable prizes, this year's list of prizes is even more impressive. even wider array of area businesses and residents are donating more than 50 valuable prizes. A ticket is reproduced on the next page so you can see for yourself. Tickets are \$1 each or six for \$5 -- contact any board member (see directory) to buy a handful -- or buy them at the picnic. FRIENDS PRESCHOOL ART FAIR IN TYLER PARK JUNE 21

As noted above, Friends Preschool will have its annual Art Fair in Tyler Park this year, the same day as the Annual Picnic.

Friends Preschool is a parent-run non-profit cooperative day center currently located at Andrew's Episcopal Church Woodbourne Avenue. About 50 fami-(including some neighbors) participate in programs for children up to kindergarten age; a special aspect of the program is that it mainstreams handicapped pre-school children into the regular program.

This will be Friends' fourth Art Fair. The quality of the crafts and artwork is well above average comparable to that you might have seen at the Cherokee Park Art Fair last month. TPNA is pleased to be sharing time, space, and publicity for its Annual Picnic with this event.

Currently, playground supervisors are scheduled to be in Tyler Park from 11 AM until 6:30 PM (at the request of working parents) on weekdays starting June 22.


JOGGING TRAILS REPAINTED



TENNIS COURTS RESURFACED; METRO PARKS TENNIS LESSONS BEGIN IN JUNE

During Derby weekend, when everyone was too busy losing money on Demons Begone to play tennis, Metro Parks resurfaced all six tennis courts in Tyler Park. The asphalt needed to cure before the courts could be repainted, so the smaller courts got finished first. But by the time you get this newsletter, all nets should have been rehung and all courts repainted.

Thanks again goes to Mike Carrell, Third Ward Alderman, for his help in getting city funds (\$30,000) for the resurfacing. Tyler Park's tennis courts are some of the oldest in the city, and now they are ready for many more years of heavy use.

As announced in the last newsletter, Metro Parks is offering group tennis lessons in Tyler Park beginning, intermediate, advanced levels. Cost is \$25 per session, and two three-week sessions will run from June 13 - July 3 and from July 6 - July 24. To sign up, contact Gil Clark, Metro Parks, 459-0440.

OPERATION BRIGHTSIDE PROJECT BLITZ MAY 16

Operation Brightside's Project Blitz hit Tyler Park again on May 16. Once again, Tyler Park was one of the best represented neighborhoods, with helpers from all parts of the neighborhood.

This year alleys got special attention -- which was really needed, as anyone who travels our alleys will agree. Many thanks to Brightside Committee Chair Chris Greenwell for spearheading the effort to keep Tyler Park neighborhood one of the most attractive in the city.

HELP US KEEP SPRAY POOL OPEN THIS SUMMER

The wading pool in Tyler Park was converted into a spray pool two years ago, at great effort and expense, and it is scheduled to start up again on June 15. Now the Metro Parks Department and the local Department of Public Health are warning that, if kids continue to block off drains in spray pools to make them back into wading pools (as frequently happened last year), they may be forced to shut them down for the summer. The problem is that standing water quickly develops and sustains an unhealthy level of bacteria, and the Division Environmental Health doesn't have many choices other than shutting down the pool to protect public health.

You know how hot it can get here in the summer. Please do your part to keep kids from plugging up the spray pool. We don't need a bunch of hot, grumpy kids moping around the park this summer.

TYLER PARK EASTER EGG HUNT A BIG SUCCESS

Back to a normal level of hysteria again. The annual Tyler Park Easter Egg Hunt was held as scheduled in the park at noon on Saturday, April 18. Dozens (as opposed to the many hundreds we had last year) of excited but controllable kids covered every square meter of the upper side of the park in search of eggs and special prizes. It was a big help to limit participation to kids who either live in (or have family in) the Tyler Park neighborhood.

The larger of your two newsletter editors agreed to act as the Easter Bunny -- but the rented suit was too tight for comfort, so the smaller of your newsletter editors filled in, with a great sense of bunny style.

Thanks again to Pat Nett for her willingness to make this such a special event. There are more details to take care of than you would ever imagine.

NEW SIGNS ON PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT

Of course, we know that no one who gets this newsletter would ever consider abusing the new playground equipment we have been working so hard to obtain and install. Unfortunately, Tyler Park gets used by hundreds of people who don't get the newsletter -- some of whom have only a dim idea of property rights.

Therefore, the TPNA Board authorized two new signs for display on the equipment.
