


SUNSET EAST NOISE

RECYCLING AT LOCAL CHURCH

Remember when there was not only an energy crisis but also some concern for renewable resources? St. Paul United Methodist Church, at 2000 Douglass Avenue (at Bardstown Road) is doing its part to continue saving a few resources by recycling aluminum cans and newspaper. The church has a truck on its rear parking lot during the second weekend of each month, usually from Friday night to Tuesday morning. Papers should be bundled or bagged, and cans should be bagged.

Every little bit helps. As area landfills get full, we may be required to separate these renewable items from our trash, so you might as well get in the habit.

BOARD APPROVES FORMATION OF TPNA FOUNDATION TO PROMOTE LONG TERM SUPPORT OF TYLER PARK

At its April meeting, the TPNA Board approved the formation of the Tyler Park Endowment Fund. The Fund will be started with \$10,000 of TPNA's reserves, with \$5,000 to be contributed in 1988 and the remaining \$5,000 in 1989.

The Endowment Fund's assets will be held and managed along with other endowment funds by the Louisville Community Foundation. Interest on the funds will be used exclusively for programs and projects to benefit Tyler Park. Creating the fund now and enabling others to contribute to it will ensure that the park gets maintained and beautified for many years.

TPNA encourages donations of any size to the Endowment Fund. (Make your tax deductible checks payable to "Tyler Park Endowment Fund" and send them to Stephen L. Henry, M.D., Chairman of the Fund, at the TPNA address found on this newsletter.) Donations will be restricted for this use only and used solely for the future of a beautiful Tyler Park.

P.S. If you can use your own 25-cent stamp on the enclosed envelope, you will save TPNA close to 50 cents, which is what the Post Office charges for permit mail.

BRIGHT SITE TO BE INSTALLED SOON

At its April meeting, the TPNA board approved the landscaping of a "Bright Site" (part of Operation Brightside) at the west end of the park (where Castlewood and Tyler Park Drive intersect). Trees, flowers, and edging will be added, in a design intended to harmonize with what Frederick Olmstead's original design for Tyler Park.

TPNA's contribution included paying for the installation of a water line and for some of the plantings; Operation Brightside folks will do the actual landscaping, using some plants donated by local businesses. Target for completion: June 12.
