## Realtor committed to serving neighborhood






Chris Greenwell, Treasurer



# Lunches help the elderly

When my husband Bill and I recently read that the Highland Community Minstries was in dire need of volunteers to help deliver hot meals to homebound older people, we quickly decided to help. I hope you will decide to help too.

I have become the coordinator for "Meals on Wheels" on Wednesdays. These are meals delivered to the homebound in downtown and Old Louisville from Norton Hospital.

I know these elderly people depend on these meals. Many can no longer fix hot, nourishing meals for themselves. Delivering these meals allow many of these people to remain in their homes.

Whenever a regular delivery person cannot make their scheduled deliveries, Bill pitches in to help.

Bill says that delivering these meals can be "both rewarding and frustrating. You make a delivery and people are so appreciative. The sense of accomplishment is rewarding. I'm frustrated though, when I realize that so many more elderly people need hot meals and aren't able to get them."

The meals, a cross between a hot school-lunch and an airline-type meal, are not elaborate.

However, they are nutritionally balanced, and special lunches are available for those with dietary restrictions.

You can help. Please call the Highland Community Ministries Outreach Program for Older Persons at 584-3834, and ask for Bruce. He'll help you give just one hour of your time a week delivering hot noon meals. It will mean so much to an elderly homebound person. Your satisfaction in knowing that you have helped will mean so much to you.
