### Aldermanic debate a success

On Wednesday, April 12, your Tyler Park Neighborhood Association sponsored a debate featuring the three aldermanic candidates in the Third Ward aldermanic primary race.

Incumbent Linda Solley and challengers Tom Owen and John Weikel were invited to address a gathering of Tyler Park residents and our neighbors from Deer Park and the Cherokee Triangle.

A schedule change forced the debate to move to the the Musicians Union Local 11-637 on Bardstown Road. Despite the last minute change of venue, nearly 150 of our neighbors attended.

Each candidate privately addressed the audience and then all three answered questions submitted by the audience. The three drew straws to determine the order of the evening. Ms. Solley spoke first, followed by Mr. Owen and Mr. Weikel.

My background and experience are a prologue to the future. With me, you don't have to reinvent the wheel.


My experience and dependability will count for you, the Third Ward, and all of Louisville.


