President's message:

Let's keep Tyler Park moving!

As we approach the end of the Tyler Park year, I want to take this opportunity to thank Tyler Park Executive Board for their many hours dedication to our park and neighborhood. Events such as the Easter Egg Hunt, annual picnic, and City Fair are enjoyed by each of us.

However, many of the Board members spend great time and effort towards other projects such as the Neighborhood Park Projects and Priorities Committee, the By-Laws Committee, and the Tyler Park Endowment Fund. All of these are vital to the future of the park's preservation and beautification during the 990's. Such committee work rarely receives neighborhood recognition or appreciation. Members of these committees have donated hundreds of hours. Their efforts are appreciated.

Several recent committee proposals are of neighborhood interest:

The By-Laws Committee has recommended a change in the definition of the Tyler Park year. Our operational year has started with the election of the officers in January. A proposal has been made to elect officers and the board during the summer months with the operational year beginning in September for

twelve months. This change would allow the officers and Tyler Park Board to better prepare for major neighborhood events like City Fair and the annual Tyler Park Neighborhood Picnic.

The current proposal, if passed, would take effect in September 1990. Election of new board members will proceed in November as in the past. If you are interested in serving on the Tyler Park Board, please call 588-5319 or 451-5774.

The Neighborhood Projects and Priorities Committee has formed a comprehensive outline of neighborhood and park problems and deficiencies. This report has been submitted to the Board for approval. If you have any suggestions regarding our neighborhood or park, please call 588-5319.

Lastly, the Endowment Committee has recommended that the Tyler Park Board donate the \$5,000 committed last year to the

Endowment Fund. This fund is held in escrow by the Louisville Community Foundation. During 1989 many individuals in your neighborhood donated over \$900 specifically to this fund. Remember, your donations to the Endowment Fund are restricted. Only its interest will be used for park projects. Make your tax deductible contributions using the form below.

The Tyler Park Board feels that the Endowment Fund is essential to maintaining our park's current standard and will be essential for major projects in the park in the 1990's. We will appreciate your contributions.

Kentucky Humane Society grows

Construction is underway at the Kentucky Humane Society for a renovated and expanded facility to accomodate a greater number of lost and unwanted animals and to offer them maximum care. The Society is located at 241 Steedly Drive in Louisville.

Included in the expansion will be a second kennel wing with 16 new dog runs, a cat solarium, new treatment and holding areas and expanded office and storage space.

In addition, there will be an education center where teachers will be encouraged to bring their classes for presentations and at the same time tour the shelter. The education center will house a variety of animal welfare issues available for circulation to those interested.

The Kentucky Humane Society-Animal Rescue League is a non-profit organization which has served our community for over 100 years in numerous capacities. They provide shelter, nourishment and medical attention to the animals in their care. They have an active adoption program and offer grooming and euthanasia services. 
