
The fun begins at Noon, Saturday, March 30, 1991. Make sure you arrive a little early so you don't miss anything.

TPNA supports Scenic Kentucky

Bonnie Betz Loeb of Scenic Kentucky was the guest speaker of TPNA's January Board of Directors meeting. Scenic Kentucky is a private, non-profit membership organization devoted "to protecting Kentucky's scenic resources and to reversing the tide of visual pollution".

Scenic Kentucky seeks the support of all concerned citizens, including our neighborhood association, in putting an end to sign clutter. On February 6, 1991, the TPNA Board of Directors adopted a resolution presented by Scenic Kentucky requesting our elected officials to (l) ban the construction of new billboards, (2) establish height and size regulations and (3) establish scenic corridors where billboards are restricted.

TPNA needs volunteers -we need you!

Your neighborhood association's Board of Directors is a very hard-working group of individuals. As most of our neighbors are aware, the Tyler Park Neighborhood Association hosts numerous activities for the young and old throughout the year.

For the current year, activities include the annual Easter Egg Hunt, Spring park clean-up, the Picnic and Raffle, a Park Tennis Tournament, a Flea Market, Summerscene programs for children, Summer concerts, the annual meeting, a Park Halloween party and City Fair.

TPNA also addresses neighborhood complaints and issues. The Board of Directors works directly with our aldermen and other city officials to solve current problems. For example, TPNA obtained the support of Alderman Tom Owen and his staff in getting dead limbs cut from the trees along Eastern Parkway.

Zoning issues are also a frequent topic of discussion for the Board. The Mid-City Mall, the Schuster Building and the White Castle lot are current concerns. We are also working with the City to obtain funds for park improvements.

The Board of Directors appreciates the support of our neighbors. We encourage each and everyone of you to get involved. We welcome you to contact us and offer your help on one of our many committees and projects. Block captains are also needed. We are sure you will be glad you did!
