

Block Captains Sought


Have you ever wondered how you can get to know your neighbors better and do something for your community at the same time?

Two Events Shape Bardstown Road

Schuster Theaters Win Approval

On a 4-1 vote, the City Board of Zoning Adjustment approved the variances needed to finally develop the and restore the Schuster Building back into its role as a theater.

Ed Hart, the owner of the property, and Marvin Sussmann, the theater operator have thanked Tyler Park and the other immediately proximate neighborhoods for their support during the long process leading to approval.

A number of conditions were set and they must be met before the theaters can open. First, the city must establish a parking permit system for the neighbors on Sherwood which are most affected by the theaters. This program will be a first for Louisville, but should not be considered as a pilot program for general restrictions on parking throughout the city. Secondly, the city needs to provide more on-street parking by striping existing parking so places can be identified, removing some unnecessay TARC stops and providing handicap places near the intersection with Bardstown Road.

In addition, Alderman Tom Owen has provided the planning and some start-up funds for a trolley system to provide access for most of the Bardstown Corridor.

Tyler Park residents can help by attending the theaters when they open in late fall of 1993 and by walking and using the trolley not only for the theater but for other activities along the corridor.



Highland Branch to Move

The final Branch Library plan has been approved by the Library Advisory Commission and has budget approval by local government. The plan provides for the Highland Branch to move to a larger and more accessible location by July 18th of this year. As part of the plan, the former Shelby Park Branch will close and its activities will be mergedd with the new branch. The question remains as to the name of the new branch. Several neighborhood leaders are concerned that the single name "Highland Branch" does not serve a a proper recognition of the long-standing role the Shelby Park Branch played in community affairs for over 50 years. On the other hand, few were in favor of the name proposed by the review panel, "The Midcity Branch". Where is "Midcity", anyway? If you have any suggestions (Bardstown Road Branch has been often mentioned) please convey them to Janet Dakan, of the TPNA Board who is also the co-chair of the Friends of the Library Highland Branch chapter.

The Mid-City Mall is often mentioned as the logical choice for the location of the new branch. The mall has space, is accessible, has ample parking and could use the foot traffic generated by the branch to improve its rental possibilities. It is not a totally foregone conclusion that the branch will go into the Mall. A petition, recommending the Mall, or an other suitable site, is enclosed on the back of this page. Please circulate it among your close neighbors and deliver it to the branch as soon as possible.

Wherever the location, the Tyler Park Neighborhood Association has agreed to supply the muscle power and a few trucks to move the branch in mid-July. We will have specific instructions on how you can help with the move in the next newsletter.

Don't fret over the old library building. It will not be torn down. However, finding an appropriate use for the building is a major goal of our friends in Cherokee Triangle and is of importance to the whole area. If you have suggestions, don't hesitate to call.

REQUEST FOR PUBLIC COMMENT ON MID-CITY MALL AS THE NEW LOCATION FOR HIGHLAND/SHELBY PARK LIBRARY

The Library Advisory Commission and the staff of the Library recommend Mid-City Mall as the location for the consolidation of the Highland and Shelby Park Library branches. This site meets all selection criteria. We invite your comments on the selection and any other location that would meet the general criteria.

Criteria for New Location

The following are the general criteria for site selection:

- 1. access by public transportation
- 2. access from both the Highland and Shelby Park areas
- 3. 5,000 10,000 square feet on one level
- 4. floor must carry 150 lbs. per square foot live load
- 5. parking
- 6. handicap-accessible
