The year 1994 saw quite a bit of activity involving the TPNA. We worked with Metro Parks and Alderman Tom Owen to select the style and placement of new lights

installed along the walkways in Tyler Park. Participation in TPNA sponsored activities such as the picnic increased, as did the number of members on our Board of Directors. We participated in meetings of Bardstown Road Tomorrow and the Highland Connection, groups whose members represent the area's residents and businesses. And the TPNA sponsored meetings to promote the exchange of information as controversy arose over the plan to put theaters in Mid-City Mall.

The Tyler Park Neighborhood Association continues to devote serious effort and energy toward improving the quality of life for all of us. As always, we

need your help. We need more people to work with us, to bring up new ideas for improving the neighborhood, and to help us carry them out. We need to hear more of the views of the neighborhood residents, to let us know how we have been doing and how we should move forward. Let us know how you feel about issues so we can better represent your interests.

Take, for example, the ongoing controversy over the plan to put theaters in Mid-City Mall. When we first heard about the prospect of a neighborhood theater returning to the local area, the TPNA Board expressed its support. Later, when we heard that eight theaters were planned, and heard from the residents in the immediate area about traffic congestion and concerns, we told the Planning Commission that we favored a scaled down version of the plan. Presently, we are hoping for a win-win solution that would allow the theaters to be created, but in a way that addresses the concerns of safety, congestion, litter, etc. We'd like to know what you think!

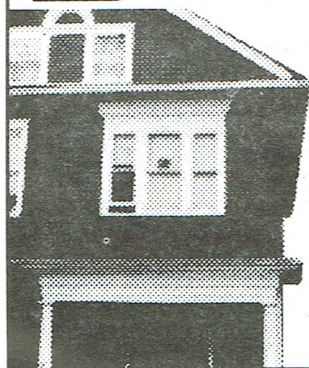

EDITORIAL

Editor's Column

Welcome to the *Tyler Park Bridge*. This is the first issue of what we hope will become a regular monthly publication. Our goal is to bring you news of the neighborhood, items of general interest and (to the best of our ability) entertainment.

Our hope for regular monthly publication means we'll have to dedicate time every week - and we can do that, most weeks. It also means I will have to get my own schedules on track. (The other people who work on this are real fireballs who seem to have their lives thoroughly under control). You can look to this column to see how an old hand at procrastination and management by disaster is getting along.

In short, I'm a man of average desperation who muddles through life. Every time you see this column it means I've made it

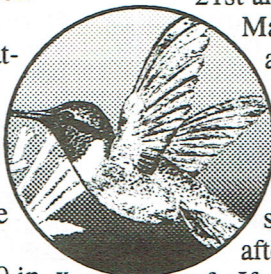

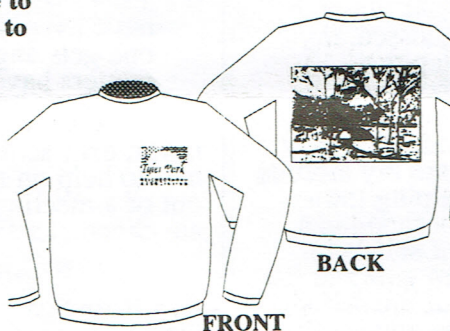
