## TYLER PARK NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION PARK & NEIGHBORHOOD IMPROVEMENT COMMITTEE

he following is a reprint of a letter sent to Metro Parks from John Reilly on behalf of the TPNA. The letter was written as a direct result of observations made by the Parks and Neighborhood Improvement Committee while on a walk-thru of the park aimed at determining the parks immediate needs.

#### To The Metro Parks Department:

The Board of Directors of the Tyler Park Neighborhood Association (TPNA) is requesting that the items listed below be incorporated into Metro Parks workplans for the remainder of the year.

They were developed by the TPNA Park and Neighborhood Improvement Committee and are listed in order of priority.

- 1. Replace the chain link fence which was removed from along the Castlewood Road border of the park, for the safety of children playing in the park so that they cannot enter the roadway in the path of an oncoming vehicle. (Please note that we do not intend to imply that the replacement must also be of the same material as the original. We would welcome the opportunity to participate in the process of selecting an appropriate material and style, possibly similar to our participation in the selection of the lights along the walkways).
- 2. Replace damaged spiral slide in the playground on the west side of the park.
- 3. Clear out undergrowth and dead wood:
- remove dead tree in park near Tyler Park Drive and Edgeland Avenue;
- remove tree stumps, felled dead trees, logs from west side along Tyler Park Drive;
- remove dead trees from peninsula between Tyler Park Drive and Windsor Place.

- 4. Refurbish tot lot:
- update equipment, especially toddler swings;
- · renew play base;
- · rake leaves;
- · plant grass seed outside tot lot;
- paint jungle gym;
- add sign indicating suggested ages for children using tot lot.
- replace gate and latch.
- **5**. Remove glass embedded in soil and plant grass seed near the volleyball courts by the entrance to the tunnel
- **6**. Plant grass seed where trenches were dug to bury wiring for lights.
- 7. Remove broken piece of old fence at southwest corner of Tyler Park Drive and Baxter Avenue
- 8. Post a sign with the message "Please leash and clean up after your dog."
- 9. Add another grill near picnic tables that don't already have one.
- 10. Upgrade the volleyball court with a finer grade of sand.
- 11. Inspect the mortar in the Tyler Park bridge. Make recommendation for timing and extent of tuckpointing that may be needed.
- 12. Remove the flagpole at the band-stand.

We would like to once again acknowledge the strong and effective working relationship between TPNA and Metro Parks to which both parties have contributed. We look forward to continuing that relationship in 1995.


