Also, from 3:00 to 4:30 music will be heard from Louisville's own Force Wells and the Walnut Street Blues Band.


So come prepared with a chair or a blanket and, most of all, good dancing shoes! You will be richly rewarded!

Personal Safety Awareness...


The TPNA wants to call your attention to some incidents that have occurred recently in the neighborhood. As always, we do not intend to alarm, but rather to raise awareness.

In early July there was an assault and attempted rape that happened after midnight in one of the neighborhood alleys. As a resident arrived home and got out of the car, a man with a flashlight claimed to be a member of a neighborhood security patrol. After the assault, the man fled in his car. The assailant was described as a 40 to 50 year old white male, with graying hair driving a maroon vehicle.

Please be aware that the Tyler Park neighborhood has no such patrol, and you should be immediately suspicious of anyone claiming to be a member.

There have also been reports of late night prowlers in the neighborhood, as well as reports of break-ins. If you see or hear any suspicious activity, please notify the police.
