# TPNA Annual Fall Festival - Sunday, September 7, 2PM until dark

# Music, Music, Music!

Spend a day in the park to the sound of music from three great professional groups. There will be Bluegrass from **New Horizon** starting at 2 PM. Folk music will be provided by **Winston Hardy and the Roadmasters** at 4 PM. The Big Band sounds of **Ovation** will go from 6:30 to 8:30 PM. All at the band stand in the park.

#### For Kids and Families

This year special attention is given to kids and families. The Louisville Police will have the **Talking Car**, **Officer McGruff** taking a "bite out of crime", and the **Crime Prevention** booth. The Louisville Fire Department will be on hand with **fire engines** and emergency vehicles, and will give out fire helmets and coloring books. The Highland-Shelby Park Library will present three **puppet shows** starting at 2PM. Girl Scouts will conduct **craft stations** for kids. All these activities will focus on the 2-4:30 afternoon time.

#### Food & Drink

Local vendors will provide a variety of food and drink throughout the day. Most will be located near or under the bridge. Picnic tables will be available throughout the park on a first come, first served basis whether you purchase food or bring it from home.

Raffle Grand Prize: \$300 Cash

The proceeds from the annual Raffle provide the financial support for the TPNA Fall Festival. This year there are a few new twists. As has been the case the past several years, more than forty local merchants have provided merchandise or gift certificates. But this year a **Grand Prize of \$300** cash will be awarded to one lucky winner. You need not be present to win the Grand Prize or any of the other prizes. Drawings for winners will begin at 4:30 PM and continue until 6:30 PM. The Grand Prize drawing will be at 6 PM.

There will be an additional **Bonus Cash Prize of** \$100 awarded at 6:30 PM, but you must be present to win that prize.

Raffle tickets will be \$1 each. They will be available from TPNA Board members selling door to door in the neighborhood prior to September 7, as well as at the raffle booth on the day of the festival. Winners names will be posted at the raffle booth throughout the afternoon.

#### **Arts & Crafts Booths**

Would you like to set up a booth to sell your treasures and trinkets during the Festival? Space will be available during Festival hours for \$20 per booth. No percentage of sales will be charged. There will be a **fine art and retail** section and a **yard sale** area. Another section will be for civic or political organizations. 
