Tyler Park Wine Tasting

From 5:00-7:00 p m on January 27, 2008 the Mid City Mall was transformed into a decorative gathering for 139 neighborhood participants at the TPNA Wine Tasting. The event featured music from the trio Appalatin, hors d'ouevres from ValuMarket Highlands Deli, flowers from ValuMarket, wine from The Wine Market, and a marvelous combination of neighbors in constant conversation.

At 4:45, the hip and sassy trio Appalatin set the tone as the wine tasting ticket holders entered the Mall. Volunteers greeted you as you put on a nametag, grabbed your wine glass, and studied your tasting card. The cordoned off area (ABC Laws require this) had three wine tasting tables on one side, three hors d'ouevres tables on the other side and five conversation tables at each end. Tablecloths, flowers, and aromas from food and wine gave the event a party like atmosphere as you tried to decide just where to begin.

Our goal as The Wine Tasting Committee was to provide a winter activity that would promote community building. We learned from our last event that you would come at 5:00 and you would stay until 7:00, so we provided more space and a better traffic flow from food to wine to conversation.

We began planning the event at the end of July. All of this would not be possible without our business neighbors. The actual cost of a ticket would be \$40.00 each without generous donations.

Gordo and Claudia Jackson, the owners of The Wine Market and Old Town Wine & Spirits recruited the wine pourers, provided glasses, and chose the wines with the festive names. We tasted three reds: Hey Mambo, Holy Cow Merlot, and Yard Dog Red. We tasted three whites: White Knight, Holy Cow Chardonnay, and Yard Dog White. Besides offering invaluable expertise, the Jacksons sold us the wine at their cost.

ValuMarket donated all the food and flowers.

Food included meatballs, stuffed mushrooms, sushi, crab cakes, deli meats, cheeses, fruit, vegetables, and desserts. No one went home hungry! You need to stop by and thank Melissa, the manager of Highlands Deli for all her incredible planning. Tracey from the ValuMarket floral department provided beautiful table arrangements and ribbons. ValuMarket's donation was \$4,000.


The Highlands Shelby Library provided storage for our stansions and tables which had to be delivered Friday. Staff member Beth also came up and opened the library early so we could set up and hung around until we cleaned up. This made our job infinitely easier.

City Café provided ice and water. Appalatin charged us half their normal fee. Andy Westbrook provided sound equipment. Terri Lutz provided the artwork and graphics for the posters and wine cards. Dan Bryan designed the tickets and flyers. Sandy Metts graciously allowed us to use Mid City Mall. Officer Jeff Artman provided the security.

Kathey Schickli (Drinks at the Plaza) provided a Derby hat for raffle and an add for our Wine Tasting Card. Clay&Cotton, Jackson Organic Coffee, Swanson Reed Galleries, Kaleidoscope, Terry Hall Redden at Semonin, Highlands Family Denistry, Hopkins Interior Construction Company, The Fish House and Café Beignet also provided ads for the Wine Tasting Card.

The total cost of donations and ads came to \$5,500. That's not even counting volunteer hours. Thank you to the most excellent committee Julie French (Windsor Place), Kathey Schickli (Tyler Pkwy), Rebecca Watson (Rosewood), Ken Baker (Tyler Park Drive), and Ann Finney (Goddard).

As we sat at our follow up meeting at Café Beignet (Oh did I mention to support our local businesses?), we decided to do it again next January. Won't you join us?






