

A slideshow entitled "The Development of Tyler Park Neighborhood" will be presented and details of the project will be announced. SOME REMINDERS TO PROPERTY OWNERS

- 3) Shrubs, hedges or small trees along streets, sidewalks and alleys should be trimmed to allow good visibility.


There's Nothing As Pretty As A Live Christmas Tree!
