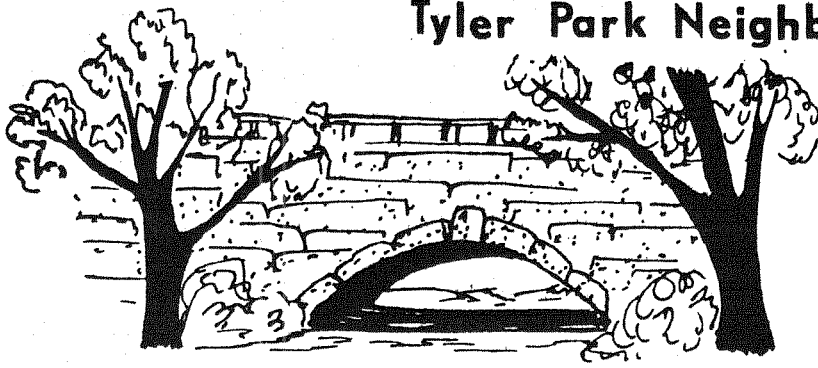

WHAT HAS TPNA DONE FOR YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD DURING THE PAST YEAR ?

In the park:

1. Obtained a \$10,000 city grant to move & renovate the tot lot.
2. Purchased & installed four pieces of playground equipment, two permanent trash containers, & a bulletin board.
3. Worked with Metro Parks to obtain full-time playground supervisors during the summer months.
4. Helped sponsor a 4-H Day Camp.
5. Organized Fall & Spring Clean-Ups.
6. Organized two summer band concerts.
7. Developed a professional quality "10 Year Master Plan for Tyler Park."

In the neighborhood:

8. Published a bimonthly newsletter sent to all neighborhood residents.
9. Provided fall dumpster service for residents.
10. Planted 32 trees throughout the area.
11. Was instrumental in having a 3 way stop installed at Tyler Park Dr. and Tyler Parkway.
12. Received a \$1,069 grant from the Ky. Humanities Council for the History Project.
13. Sponsored a neighborhood Flea Market.
14. Coordinated about 100 residents in over 1,000 hours of volunteer activities to support & improve Tyler Park.

TREE PLANTING TIME APPROACHES

Tyler Park Neighborhood Association's Park and Greening Committees have applied for a grant from the Community Match Fund. If the grant is approved, the Park Committee will be installing permanent picnic tables and a horseshoe pit. The Greening Committee will plant shrubs in the park, and trees in the park, on the Eastern Parkway median, and on street frontal private property. NEIGHBORHOOD HISTORY PROJECT BEGINS

The Kentucky Humanities Council has awarded a \$1069 grant to TPNA to begin a history of the neighborhood. Grant money will be used to present a series of lectures, subsidize oral history, and copy photographic materials. Taped interviews and photographs will be deposited with the appropriate archive at the University of Louisville, where they will be available to the public. Time and donated items will count as matching funds under the grant. A slide presentation and lecture, given at the November 22 annual meeting by project director Andrea McElderry, was the first event in the project, which will run through January, 1983. A series of three lectures will begin in March.

Want to take part? Here's what you might do: Be interviewed; suggest people who might be interviewed; suggest questions; locate photographs; provide refreshments for lecture series; give a block party where neighbors can discuss history, learn to use legal documents as sources & teach others; help with other tasks, such as publicity.
