
ATTENTION: PARENTS

NOSTALGIC TIDBITS

Did you know ...



Tyler Park was once a swamp. The Tyler Park Men's Club, forerunner of the Tyler Park Neighborhood Association, formed to improve the park in order to encourage people to build houses in the neighborhood.

Tyler Park was the sight of the fourth of July fireworks display (notably loud at times) organized by the Tyler Park Men's Club in 1915 to "encourage patriotism among our youth" during World War I. It was a city-wide event, financed by contributions from residents. The fireworks ended in 1933 because of hard economic times. Contributions that year went to charity. Ask your older friends if they remember seeing the fireworks.

The tennis courts were in existence as early as 1916. One resident tells us that her aunt complained about having to wash the hems of the long skirts, which got very dirty from dragging on the clay courts.
