

### **NEW SHOPPING CENTER?**

Planners for a new shopping center located at the Goss Ave. and Eastern Parkway intersection have met with a group of area residents who are opposed to the development. At an organizational meeting held 3/18/83, approximately 75 residents expressed formidable arguments against the center.

Speaking for area residents, Mildred Jobson stated that the function and design of our parks and parkway system are recognized nationally for their design and beauty. Another commercial venture this large would be an infringement on the original residential flavor intended for Eastern Parkway. Area residents would favor a residential development over a commercial development. Also, Eastern Parkway is functioning as a major artery for Churchill Downs the Fairgrounds, the University of Louisville, and Audubon Hospital. This intersection would become more conjested and hazardous than it

The Board of Aldermen have approved \$19,000 from the Works Department's Cummulative Reserve Fund for improvements for Tyler Park. Improvements include \$14,000 for repairing and extending asphalt walkways and \$5,000 to re-roof and repair the shelter house. Work is scheduled to begin in May, with completion expected by early summer. TPNA expresses a special thanks to Alderman Mike Carrell and his office for their efforts and assistance in improving Tyler Park.
