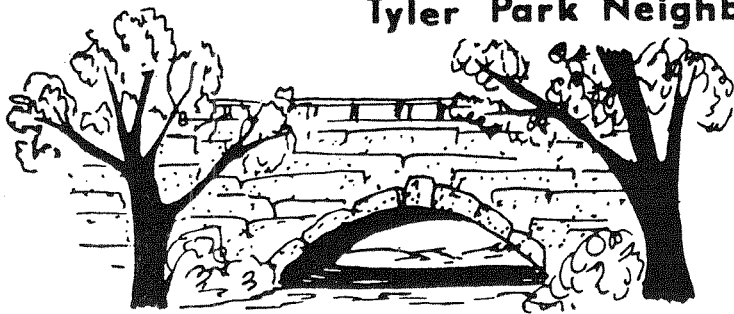

TYLER PARK HISTORY PROJECT

Thank you to all who responded to the note on "Shopping in Tyler Park Neighborhood" which appeared in the last Newsletter. One mistake needs correcting. Parrott Cleaners on Edenside and Bardstown was the original occupant of the building which was once the main Parrott plant.

"Impressions of the Way We Were: Tyler Park" is a slide-tape production which represents the end of the first phase of the history project. You can see it on November 13 at the annual meeting. Watch your Newsletter for the exact time and place. In the meantime, please look through your photograph collections to see if you have any of the following: the stage in Tyler Park which was on the site of the present tot lot; the original Erhmann's on Bardstown Road; the Stoertz Dairy Farm (where the Medical Arts Building is now); Mengels' dahlia farm (where Summit and Dahlia are now); Bear Grass Creek before the walls were built; Eleven Joneses' Cave; Fourth of July in Tyler Park, 1911-1931; the firehouse at 1330 Bardstown Road when it was a firehouse; sledding in Tyler Park; any old Park scenes; and any old street scenes.
