When movies first became popular, Tyler Park residents had to take the streetcar downtown to the Rialto on Fourth Street (which had live stage shows as well as moving pictures). But movie theaters quickly followed people out Bardstown Road. JOGGING TRAILS

Have you wondered what the arrows in the Park are all about? Bill Franck, one of Tyler Park's distance runners, borrowed a surveyor's wheel and measured three courses for joggers, runners, and walkers.

COURSE #1: Yellow arrows, one mile. From the pavillion in the Park counter-

clockwise around the loop five times.

COURSE #2: Green arrows, one mile.

From pavillion to Castlewood and Tyler
Park Drive exit, up Tyler Park Drive
to Baxter, across bridge to Edenside
sidewalk, to Tyler Park Drive, under bridge, counterclockwise around the loop.

COURSE #3: Rose arrows. One and a half miles. From pavillion under bridge, left up steps across Tyler Park Drive to Rosewood, to Bellwood, to Windsor, to Baxter across bridge to Edenside sidewalk, in Park to Tyler Park Drive sidewalk, back under bridge to pool.


