## TPNA's 2019 Repair Affair

Repair Affair is organized and sponsored by New Directions Housing Corp. of Louisville. NDHC are in contact with many homeowners in the area who cannot afford and/or are physically unable to maintain their homes. The homeowners are often retired widows on fixed incomes. NDHC gathers volunteer teams from various originations in the metro area who have the skills and willingness to spend a Saturday in June performing simple repairs and maintenance for others

On June 15, the Tyler Park Neighborhood Association fielded a Repair Affair team for the second year. We were successful in recruiting 3 experienced home handymen, 2 enthusiastic gardeners and a couple of generalists who put their hand to anything. We were: Bob Belcher, Ray Brundige, Mike Gramig, Bill Hause, Paula Head, Liz Thrasher, and me, Doug Thrasher. It was particularly gratifying that we had volunteers who are not usually involved in the TPNA board.

The houses that NDHC offered the TPNA team in 2019 were not seriously deficient and so we decided to take on two homes this year. One home, in the far west of Louisville, needed some vinyl flooring replaced in a bathroom, some minor caulking on some otherwise unfinished construction and replacement of some exterior steps which were unsafe

and without any hand rail as pictured here. We split the TPNA crew with the three handiest starting on this home. They finished the new floor and rear stairs in good time.

The other house needed all outside work, including caulking window and door frames, repainting the front stoop and handrails and general tidying up of the yard and fencing. Brush removal from the chain link fence was more extensive and time consuming than expected. It eventually took a reciprocating saw to get some of the vines out of the chain links. We also repaired and repainted the hand

railings, caulked and painted all the window and door frames that could be reached. We removed the old loose paint and then repainted the front stoop. And we nearly filled the dumpster with old unneeded stuff. Bob B stayed a bit longer on the floor repair at the first house, but Mike G and Bill H. Came to the other house for lunch and helped wind that site up too.





We didn't spend much time taking pictures but at the end of the work we looked like this (note the full dumpster behind us) left to right are: Doug Thrasher, Mike Gramig, Liz Thrasher, Paula Head and Ray Brundige. The camera shot missed Bill Hause to my left and Bob Belcher was still at the other house.

This was a very satisfactory effort by all concerned. We hope and believe we made life a little easier and safer for our metro neighbors and spread the idea that the Tyler Park Neighborhood is part of a caring Louisville community.
