All residents are welcome to attend the annual Tyler Park Neighborhood Association Easter egg hunt. The hunt will be held Saturday April 11th at 12 noon. One area of the park will be designated for each of the following age groups:

Toddlers (under 3 years) Three to five years Six to eight year old Nine to twelve year olds


The exact location of the event may be different from previous years due to the reconstruction of the park. The restrooms and playground west of the bridge will be closed, and any area of construction will be considered "off-limits" to the children for safety reasons.

Each child should bring a basket or bag for collecting the eggs and line up with the appropriate age group until the official start of the hunt is announced.

# PARK CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

## Renovation and construction of

Tyler Park is in its final stage!



If you have been by the park recently you've noticed the buzz of activity that has been going with bulldozers, steamrollers and construction workers assembling the new playground.

I know everyone is getting excited for the park to fully re-open later this spring but I wanted to highlight some of the great work Olmsted Parks Conservancy, Louisville Parks & Recreation, District 8 Councilman Brandon Coan, and your Tyler Park Neighborhood were able to accomplish through the \$1.1 million Tyler Park restoration process.

When the planning process for renovating the Park began, TPNA worked hand-in-hand with Olmsted Parks Conservancy to create a master plan that prioritized our needs for the park while also maintaining its historic integrity. One of the things that topped our list was new bathrooms. Earlier this year those bathrooms were completed and we now have a beautiful new building with four bathrooms that will be protected by a security system, <u>thanks to additional support from Councilman Coan.</u>

Additionally, the neighborhood voiced their opinion that preserving the tennis courts was a top priority. Because of our advocacy, the historic 1910 tennis courts were fully resurfaced and restored this summer as the project's first phase. We are still actively raising money to restore the second set of four courts, and you can donate online at <u>www.TylerPark.org</u> to help us achieve our goal.

We also heard from parents who wanted the toddlers play area and big kids playground to be close together to make watching multiple kids easier. The new combined playground is nearly complete with crews working to assemble the swings, slides and playground equipment.

Another important feature of the park the neighborhood wanted was a spraygound. For many years the park had a round wading pool and then a fountain in that area. Today a large spraygound has been completed with a design that harkens back to the original wading pool. This will be a feature heavily used and loved by parents and kids for many years to come.

Lastly, after extensive input from the neighborhood, a beautiful 9-foot-wide accessible walkway funded by the City of Louisville will replace the stairs underneath the park's iconic and historic bridge. This walkway will not only improve accessibility between both sides of the park, but will also enhance the vista through the bridge's tunnel and feature plantings to better control stormwater and flooding. Construction on this is nearly complete.

So then, what's left? Once the construction is complete on the path and the playground is installed, construction crews will be adding an asphalt path adjacent to the restroom and leading to the ramp before cleaning up and re-grading the work area. Olmsted Parks Conservancy will be installing rain gardens at the base of the bridge and planting around the sprayground, playground, and restroom to mitigate storm water runoff and beautify the park. Lighting will be installed under the tunnel to increase visibility.

This project has been years in the making and wouldn't have been possible without the input from neighbors like you. Please save the date for the ribbon cutting, which has been scheduled (weather permitting) for May 4 at 11:30 AM.



# **TPNA's 2019 Repair Affair**

TPNA is making plans for another year of Repair Affair. This is a one day effort to help homeowners in the Louisville area with household repairs and or upkeep that they are unable to do themselves. It is organized city wide by the nonprofit New Directions Housing Corp. N.D.H. receives requests for assistance from the homeowners and co ordinates teams from churches, businesses neighborhood associations and other local organizations to provide volunteers do the work. N.D.H. also provides all the materials needed. Tyler Park Neighborhood Association intends to participate again this year. The work day will be June 13 2020 starting about 8:30 AM and depending on the work needed materials are usually at the worksite when we start. N.D.H. gives us choice of houses to work on well before the date and TPNA will not take on a project until we know how big a team we will have. Last year we had 7 people with varying skill levels and strength. TPNA's team was able to help two homeowners with repairs needed to improve the living conditions in their houses.

So please let me know if you will be volunteering this year. The bigger the team, the bigger project TPNA can take on. It is helpful to our less fortunate neighbors in Louisville and it is good fun as well.

## **Finance Committee Update**

It brings me great joy to report that thanks to our board, membership, local businesses and supporters we have raised over \$50,000 for the renovations of the four adjacent tennis courts in our Park. As of this writing 11 individuals, businesses and organizations have contributed \$1,000 or more and will be given formal thanks of appreciation by having their names forever written in the commemorative plaque that will be posted by the courts for everyone to read for years to come. I am awed by your generosity and community spirit and so grateful to live amongst you.

You may recall from prior reports that our goal was to raise a much higher figure because the cost to renovate the courts was estimated to be \$120K. Recently I was informed that the actual cost has increased to \$170K. As of this writing we have no assurance that the additional funds will materialize in time to have the courts finished this Spring, but I am still hopeful. Our back-up plan is to continue fund raising until we have the funds to renovate the courts.

## **Tree Committee Report**

The Trees Committee planted no trees this fall. We gathered orders from neighborhood homeowners and MSD grant money to support the plantings but have delayed planting activities until later in the spring. By the time you are reading this the Committee will have met to organize for the planting and the fall campaign. So, we have planted no new trees yet.

There have been tree heroes, though, including the volunteers who showed up to plant 25 trees in the park last spring, and volunteers who came to the park on March 7 to replace trees that had not survived last year's wild weather, and to plant additional trees for Councilman Coan's Planting of the Green program.

Special hero status is deserved by Ernst Trachsel, Jo Shipley, and Josh White who watered over 200 trees, twice, during the summer dry spell. Their effort nourished trees on public property from I-65 along Eastern Parkway to Cherokee Park and along Douglass Blvd,. and also included trees in our park, Cherokee Park, Seneca Park, Camp Taylor Memorial Park, and the Douglass Community Center Thanks for citizen action above and beyond the call.


