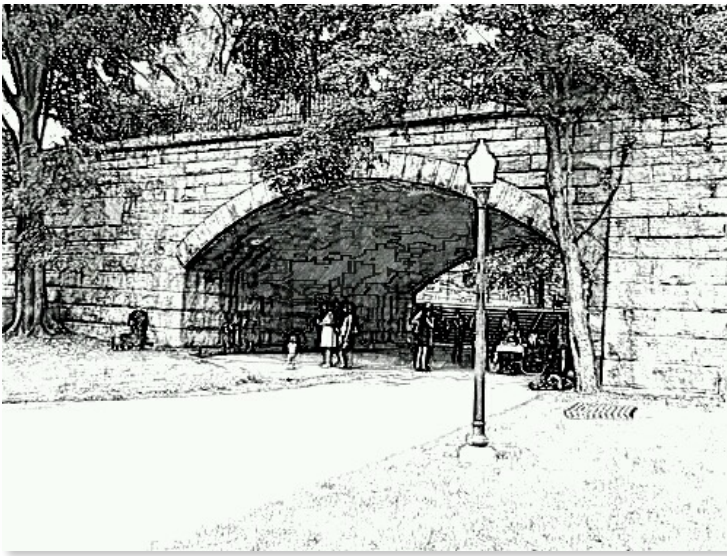


“Sundays in September” Jazz Fest is Back

The Tyler Park Neighborhood Association accomplished many feats this Summer as our fortunes changed and we welcomed many people back to our park and neighborhood.

Our summer programing kicked off with the re-launch of **Kentucky Shakespeare in the Park** with their performance of Romeo and Juliet. With a near record audience this truly was a community coming together to connect, heal, and again experience the joy of the free summer theater.

This summer we also launched ***The Best Yard Sale of The Decade!*** A community wide yard sale this over 20 participants and hundreds of people visiting our neighborhood. This first-time event also raised four hundred dollars for the Association thanks to the hard work of our volunteer Board.

After hearing many neighbors wanted more music in the park, we kicked off our summer pop-up music series with **Louisville Gypsy Jazz** and Zu Zu Ya Ya performing in the Tyler Park Tunnel. These family friendly performances have been a crowd pleaser for young and old alike. You'll have one more chance to catch Gypsy Jazz on August 22nd at 5pm and Zu Zu will return for a performance In October.

The Biggest event of the season was our **Old Fashioned 4th of July Celebration**. We welcomed over 500 people to the park for a day's long party featuring a kid's parade, food trucks, music by the Derby City Dandies and lawn games like dodge ball and egg toss. By all accounts this was a huge success and will be returning next year bigger and better.

The Tyler Park Neighborhood Association also helped launch a Highlands wide monthly event called **Neighborhood Nights** in partnership with six other Neighborhood Associations and District Eight Metro Council office. This event features free trolley rides, specials at local shops/restaurants and musical performances all along Bardstown Road.

Lastly, we are looking forward to re-launching the **September Jazz Festival** to close out the summer season. This event will be back in full force featuring four Sundays of Jazz in the park and will be the must attend event for all those in the neighborhood.

Tyler Park recognizes 60 historic homes, all 100 years or older

Sixty historical Tyler Park homes have been given special designation as being 100 years or older, part of ongoing efforts to celebrate the neighborhood's history.

Step up to one and you will notice a bronze plaque mounted near the entrance – or maybe the proud owners showing the plaque that will be mounted there.



The homes were all built before 1922 in the Tyler Park area, and feature a variety of architectural styles. The 60 homeowners were recently awarded century plaques by the Neighborhood Association.

Recognizing the homes helps tell the stories of some of the Highlands earliest residents, while providing a sense of place in the neighborhoods where the homes were built.

“I think the Neighborhood Association’s objective is to preserve the history but it also to foster community pride, by recognizing these homes it will create pride within the neighborhoods.” Said Jo Shipley a former Tyler Park President.

More information on Century Markers

The TPNA Century Marker recognizes Tyler Park structures, one hundred years old or older that have retained their historic charm. The structures must be well-maintained and contribute to the streetscape and neighborhood.

What is a century marker?

The marker is a rectangular bronze plaque measuring 5 inches by 3 inches. It’s cast with the TPNA bridge logo designed for the exterior of a house or building. It signifies recognition by the TPNA of the structure’s historical significance. The word “marker” derives from the 15th century term “to make your mark” and uniquely distinguishes the property and it’s significance to the neighborhood.

How do you qualify for a century marker?

Owners must determine the date of construction of their house or building by researching the history of their house in order to confirm the house is 100 years old.

What are the benefits of the marker program?

The TPNA Century Marker informs the public and neighbors about the age of a structure and its association with the Tyler Park Neighborhood. The presence of a marker also indicates that more detailed information about that structure is available in the archives of the Jefferson County Clerk’s Office.

What does a marker cost?

The cost of a marker is \$100. The plaques are made in Louisville by skilled craftsmen who pour molten bronze into sand molds. Due to this process, makers will be available after fifty homeowners have purchased. TPNA anticipates markers will be delivered once per year.

Letter to District 8 on 2 AM Closing

The following letter was sent to our District 8 Councilwoman Cassie Armstrong and copied to the Board of the Original Highlands Neighborhood Association, as directed by a vote of the TPNA Board in the July meeting. The decision to send the letter was not made lightly, but as a good neighbor response to reports of destructive and sometimes violent after hours behavior.

Dear Councilwoman,

At the monthly meeting of the Tyler Park Neighborhood Association on July 22, 2021, our Board passed a motion that our Secretary should send you written notice of our support for measures that will end the serving of liquor past 2 AM in District 8. This is that notice.

Our discussion touched on the positive economic and social effects of liquor sales and, indeed, we had passed a motion earlier in the same meeting to form a committee for a fundraising Bourbon tasting event in early 2022. Friends and neighbors operate some of the businesses that directly benefit from Bourbon tourism.

Our discussion concluded, however, that existing regulations, as enforced, do not adequately protect the quality of life for residential areas near the establishments that choose to stay open past 2 AM and that evidence supports a belief that bad actors, both in the bar industry and in the clientele, will prevent any net positive effect from accruing to any liquor service past 2 AM.

We therefore call on you as our elected representative to bring relief to the burden placed on your constituents by those who pursue personal profit or excessive indulgence past the point of responsible community behavior. The preference expressed in Board discussion is to avoid the measure of voting affected precincts dry, but to do what we must to keep our neighborhood safe.

Tree Planting for 2021

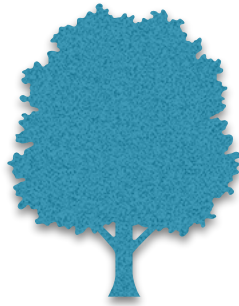

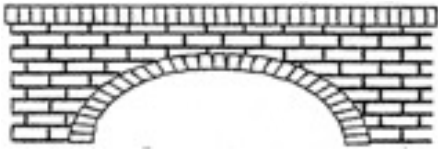
